- Use of outliner
- iterative approach
- rehearsing answers to 'open ended questions'
- lay witnesses vs. experts
- review of documents
- preparation for Cross-examination





Purpose of Direct Examination

- Adduce all evidence that is relevant to the issues
- Establish credibility of witness and rapport with trier of fact
- Anticipate and blunt the opposition attack (cross-exam)

- leading
- open ended
- transitional
- anticipatory
